Gospel Reading 26th Sunday After Pentecost

Luke 12, 16-21 Parable of the full barns of grain but empty soul.

This Gospel was chosen because it is the beginning of a series of teachings on our journey in this fasting period towards the feast of The Birth of Our Lord. Riches or poverty is not the object in itself, however, they may be an opportunity for getting closer or getting

further away from God and your neighbors.

Riches are not evil in themselves, for they come from God. However, the way in which we use these gifts can be good or bad. God gave the rich man these riches so they may be shared with others who are in need.

The rich man is a fool, despite his material success, because he vainly puts all his trust in his possessions rather than in God. The possessions became all important, even above all other things, until he was surprised by God's calling of his soul and all these material possessions were of no use.

Today's Gospel urges us to be more giving or merciful towards our neighbors, which is more according to the teachings of Our Saviour. Being good and merciful (riches) are gathered in our immortal soul where the physical death of the body can not scatter them. To be rich toward God is to have a life of close communion with Him through faith and good works.

Schedule of Services

In preparation for the Feast of the Birth of Our Lord Jesus Christ, be aware of the Christmas fasting period beginning November 15 and lasting till December 24.
