### **Nineteenth Sunday following Pentecost**

And just as you want men to do to you, you also do to them likewise.


But if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. And if you lend to those from whom you hope to receive back, what credit is that to you? For even sinners lend to sinners to receive as much back. But love your enemies, do good, and lend, hoping for nothing in return; and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High. For He is kind to the unthankful and evil. Therefore be merciful, just as your Father also is merciful.

The Gospel for the 19th Sunday following Pentecost has many examples of spiritual advice and shows us the difference between a sinful person and a righteous one. Jesus knew that the Old Testament taught, "You shall love your neighbour and hate your enemy" (Matthew 5:43). Jesus brings a new and radical command: "to love our enemies" as a true expression of life of the Kingdom. Having freed us from hate, sadness, and anger, He offers us the greatest possession of all - perfect love. Such love calls us to bless, do good, and pray - even for our enemies.

#### **Dates to Remember**

October 1 - The Feast of the Protection commemorates the appearance of the most holy Theotokos in the Church of Vlaherna in Constantinople in the tenth century. While the multitudes of the faithful were gathered in church, the Virgin Mary appeared above the faithful and spreading out her veil over them, signifying her unceasing protection of all Christians. Because of this, we keep a yearly feast of gratitude, imploring our Lady never to cease sheltering us in her mighty prayers. It confirms the Theotokos' consistent protection of Christian people.

#### Funeral




