Matthew 21: 33-44

Thirteenth Sunday following Pentecost

The Lord said this parable, "There was a householder who planted a vineyard, and set a hedge around it, and dug a wine press in it, and built a tower, and let it out to tenants, and went into another country. When the season of fruit drew near, he sent his servants to the tenants, to get his fruit; and the tenants took his servants and beat one, killed another, and stoned another. Again he sent other servants, more than the first; and they did the same to them. Afterward he sent his son to them, saying 'They will respect my son.' But when the tenants saw the son, they said to themselves, 'This is the heir; come, let us kill him and have his inheritance.' And they took him and cast him out of the vineyard and killed him. When therefore the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?" They said to him, "He will put those wretches to a miserable death, and let out the vineyard to other tenants who will give him the fruits in their seasons." Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the scriptures: 'The very stone which the builders rejected has become the head of the corner; this was the Lord's doing, and it is marvelous in our eyes?'"

The parable in this gospel teaches that God calls all of us to be responsible stewards of His gifts to us. We are free to accept this call or not. Those who do not will be left out of God's house. We are stewards in His house and not the masters. Jesus Christ shows that He is the stone that was rejected and became the corner stone on which our salvation depends.

By God's mercy, may we enjoy the fruits of our labours as we are reminded of the parable of the talents and His words, "Well done good and faithful servant, enter into the joy of your lord". *Matthew 25:23*.

Dates to Remember




September 8

The Birth of the Virgin Mary. The feast commemorates the birth of the Virgin Mary (Theotokos), the Mother of all people. It is the first feast of the new liturgical (church) year which begins on September 1.

September 14

The Feast of the Elevation of the Holy Cross. This feast commemorates the discovery by Saint Helen and Archbishop Macarios of Jerusalem, of the Holy Cross upon which Our Saviour was crucified. It is one of the most important Holy Relics of the church and considered one of the 12 Great Feasts of the church year.
