27th Sunday after Pentecost

(Healing of the woman with infirmity)

Luke 13:10-17

Now He was teaching in one of the synagogues on the Sabbath. And behold, there was a woman who had a spirit of infirmity eighteen years, and was bent over and could in no way raise herself up. But when Jesus saw her, He called her to Him and said to her, "Woman, you are loosed from your infirmity." And He laid His hands on her, and immediately she was made straight, and glorified God.

But the ruler of the synagogue answered with indignation, because Jesus had healed on the Sabbath; and he said to the crowd, "There are six days on which men ought to work; therefore come and be healed on them, and not on the Sabbath day."

The Lord then answered him and said, "Hypocrite! Does not each one of you on the Sabbath loose his ox or donkey from the stall, and lead it away to water it? So ought not this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan has bound—think of it—for eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the Sabbath?" And when He said these things, all His adversaries were put to shame; and all the multitude rejoiced for all the glorious things that were done by Him.

This Gospel shows that in spite of her infirmity and how she humbly suffered through it, the woman in the Gospel did not have the courage to request anything from Jesus Christ. She carried her cross and suffering in humility and silence. Jesus none-the-less with compassion and mercy healed her of her infirmity. God in His infinite wisdom, knows the life and sufferings of each one of us and knows our faith, humility, and patience, chooses the time and place when to relieve us of our illness and suffering. The time and method of God's response may differ from our expectations, but will always be for the salvation of all. At times God will not come when we call, at other times God will call us when we do not expect it. God loves us all and has His own timetable and methods when dealing with humans.
