### Resurrection of Our Lord (Easter Sunday)

Hristos A Înviat! Adevărat A Înviat!
Christ Is Risen! Indeed He Is Risen!

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light. The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world. He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God—children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God.

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

(John testified concerning him. He cried out, saying, "This is the one I spoke about when I said, 'He who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me.") Out of his fullness we have all received grace in place of grace already given. For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.

"But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep" (1 Corinthians 15:20), shows us that not only Christ is risen but the whole of mankind also will rise. In the Orthodox Church, strong faith in the resurrection of Jesus Christ also means strong faith in the resurrection of all people. It is for this reason we read these words in the Creed, "I expect the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come". On Resurrection morning the exclamation "Christ Is Risen" is spoken not inside the Church but outside of the church for all the believers and nonbelievers alike. The Resurrection of Jesus from the dead is the first offering of the resurrection of all who are His.

There will be no community table for the meal following the blessing. All food should be consumed away from the cemetery or at home. Those who have loved ones buried in one of the Edmonton Cemeteries and wish the graves sites blessed are requested to contact Fr. Mircea to arrange an appointment. It is appropriate that the blessing be done before Ascension Day (Ispas), which falls on June 10th this year.

#### **Schedule of Services**

#### May 2 Resurrection Canon. (N.B. Service will be celebrated outside.)

Easter Service will begin at 10:00 am with the receipt of the Light and the procession around the church followed by the rest of the Canon (Easter Matins). We will be strictly following provincial protocols for church gatherings. Masks, social distancing, and sanitizing will be strictly monitored.

Following the Service, Easter Baskets will be blessed outside on the south side of the church. We ask that you gather together, masked and in family groups keeping two metres from the next family group. There is plenty of space to spread out the circle of those gathered.
