33rd Sunday after Pentecost (Sunday of The Publican and the Pharisee)

Luke 18:10:14

"Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a Tax Collector. The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank You that I am not like other men – extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess.' And the tax collector, standing afar off, would not so much as raise his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

The Church has ordained four Sundays in the Triodion Period (Pre-Lenten cycle, of Great Lent and of Holy Week) as "preparation sundays", so we can learn that for renewal of our spiritual life, for the resurrection of our souls from death caused by sin, and to meet with Christ Crucified and Resurrected, four important things should happen; we need prayer with humility, sincere repentance, generous charity and fasting or abstinence. These sundays are given to assist us in understanding the scope and path of our spiritual ascent towards Resurrection and the means of preparation for the joyful receipt of the Light of Holy Easter.

We should learn from the good deeds of the Pharisee and the humble prayer of the Tax Collector in the gospel. Only through humility, are the doors of God's mercy opened for forgiveness of sins. Only those who repent through humble prayer can straighten their lives. The soul of the humble person is lifted by God's love. Humble prayer is the foundation of spiritual life. Humble prayer is the source of merciful life.

May The Lord assist us during this beginning of our spiritual journey and humble prayer which includes God's wish that "Who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2, 4).



Boian Cemetery Plots

N.B. The Boian Cemetery is a private cemetery owned by the members of St. Mary's Romanian Orthodox Church, Boian. Only members in good standing may reserve a burial plot. Membership fees accrue over time to the cost of the plot. Fees must be paid consecutively and continuously for the plot to be reserved. Should your membership fees lapse or are in arrears, the reserved status is then revoked.

It is the member's responsibility to inquire, from the Treasurer or any member of the Church Board, the status of his/her membership.

The current price of an unreserved plot is one thousand (1,000) dollars and is subject to change by the General Membership of St. Mary's Church.
