27th Sunday after Pentecost (Jesus heals Crippled Woman on the Sabbath)

Luke 13, 10-17

On a Sabbath Jesus was teaching in one of the synagogues, and a woman was there who had been crippled by a spirit for eighteen years. She was bent over and could not straighten up at all. When Jesus saw her, he called her forward and said to her, "Woman, you are set free from your infirmity." Then he put his hands on her, and immediately she straightened up and praised God.

Indignant because Jesus had healed on the Sabbath, the synagogue leader said to the people, "There are six days for work. So come and be healed on those days, not on the Sabbath."

The Lord answered him, "You hypocrites! Doesn't each of you on the Sabbath untie your ox or donkey from the stall and lead it out to give it water? Then should not this woman, a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan has kept bound for eighteen long years, be set free on the Sabbath day from what bound her?"

When he said this, all his opponents were humiliated, but the people were delighted with all the wonderful things he was doing.

This gospel reveals, on the one hand, God's power to heal, as shown in Jesus' healing love, and on the other hand the hidden virtues of the crippled woman who "had been bound by Satan for eighteen years" was possessed. The woman brought together the patience of carrying the crippling disease with the work of her unceasing prayer. The healing of the disease without being asked shows Jesus' love for all, especially those who have a living and merciful faith. We are also shown that good deeds are not reserved only for work days but also on holy days.

When we fulfill good deeds, those for whom they are done, are happy for them and praise Christ God for His goodness which are shown by those who do the good deeds. Our Saviour is calling us to strengthen our faith and patience, cultivate humility, and increase our prayers, in times of trials and tribulations.

Merciful people become the loving and merciful hands of Christ in the world.


