The Expulsion of Adam and Eve from Paradise (Cheese Fare Sunday)

Matthew 6, 14-21

For if you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses. Moreover, when you fast, do not be like the hypocrites, with a sad countenance. For they disfigure their faces that they may appear to men to be fasting. Assuredly, I say to you, they have their reward. But you, when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you do not appear to men to be fasting, but to your Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you openly. Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal; but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

Jesus Christ, in this Gospel talks about fasting and tells us that forgiveness is the best way to begin the fast. Our relationship with God has a direct relationship on how we relate to each other. We can not become close to God without being close to our neighbours, for we are all created in His image and likeness and therefore there exists a holy relationship between God and each one of us. The Gospel shows us that fasting is done for and by the individual, not as a prideful act to be witnessed by people but by God only. The Fast is a time to add to our being the loving and sanctifying presence of the Everlasting God. St. Luke the Evangelist tells us that the Kingdom is God is within us (Luke 17, 21) and this is a time of preparation for the ascent towards the Resurrection of Jesus Christ and the Light of Resurrection.
