Hristos A Inviat! Adevarat A Inviat! Christ Is Risen! Indeed He is Risen!!

The very first persons to see the Tomb empty, were the women who had come to anoint the body of Jesus as was the customs of the Jews. These same women were the first to know that Christ had risen when, on their way to tell the Apostles what the Angel had told them, were met by the Lord and were greeted by the word: "Rejoice!" (Matthew 28:9)

This same word "Rejoice" should be used by all of us on these days. Just as the Apostles and those close to Jesus were downfallen by the events of the crucifixion, we are downfallen by the loss of family and friends during and by this Covid -19 pandemic. Schedule of Services

April 23-24 Resurrection Eve (Midnight Service)

Resurrection Service will begin at 12:00 midnight with the receiving of the Light, the procession around the church, followed by the Divine Liturgy, and the outside Blessing of the Easter Baskets.

We would like to also resurrect the longtime tradition of the Resurrection Bonfire at Boian. The story of Moses and the Burning Bush (Exodus 3:1-4:17) is a decisive moment in which God reveals His name to Moses on Mount Sinai. The Burning Bush was on fire, but was not consumed by flames. When Moses beholds the burning bush, God speaks to Moses and tells him to lead the Israelites out of Egypt and into Canaan. The Bonfire symbolically leads us out of sin and on to Life Everlasting guided the light of Jesus' Resurrection.

We request anyone who has any cold or flu symptoms or is not comfortable to attend church, to not come. You may follow services through live streaming at stnicholaschurch.org for English and catedralasfgheorghe.ca for Romanian. Do not forget the time difference for these two churches is two (2) hrs. They are in the Eastern Time Zone.
