8th Sunday after Pentecost

Matthew 14, 14-22

And when Jesus went out He saw a great multitude; and He was moved with compassion for them, and healed their sick. When it was evening, His disciples came to Him, saying, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is already late. Send the multitudes away, that they may go into the villages and buy themselves food."But Jesus said to them, "They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat."And they said to Him, "We have here only five loaves and two fish.

"He said, "Bring them here to Me." Then He commanded the multitudes to sit down on the grass. And He took the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, He blessed and broke and gave the loaves to the disciples; and the disciples gave to the multitudes. So they all ate and were filled, and they took up twelve baskets full of the fragments that remained.



Now those who had eaten were about five thousand men, besides women and children. Immediately Jesus made His disciples get into the boat and go before Him to the other side, while He sent the multitudes away.

The feeding of the multitude takes place only **after** they were filled by His word. The urging therefore, by Jesus Christ is to first give sustenance to the soul through the listening of the Word of God and the requesting healing of the soul and body from Jesus Christ. Our Saviour shows the distinction between, but does not separate, food for the soul and food for body. Food for the soul is given more importance without denying the fact that man is a body which should not be despised, but should be cared for. The participation of the disciples distributing the loaves and fish shows us that Jesus feeds His flock at the Eucharist through His servants, priests. The gospel also shows us that each one of us should give what ever we can and to do it to the best of our ability.

Ordination

On Sunday, July 10, 2022, a member of St. Mary's Romanian Orthodox Church of Boian, Gheorghe Petrovan, was ordained to the office of Deacon at Holy Trinity Romanian Orthodox of Saskatoon, Saskatchewan. The deaconate is almost an exclusive liturgical function in which the deacon assists in the



celebration of the Divine Liturgy and other Church services. The Rev. Fr. Deacon Gheorghe has been attached to St. Mary's on the hill as a first step in the eventual ordination to the priesthood. We wish to thank Fr. Calin and Preoteasa Simona Marincasi and the members of Holy Trinity Church for wishing to host this ordination. Rev. Deacon Gheorghe is a graduate with a Master's Degree from one of the Theological Universities of Romania. He lives with his wife Domnita and their two daughters, Alexandra and Andra, in Edmonton.

May God grant newly ordained Father Deacon Gheorghe a pure and undefiled Diaconate!
