12th Sunday after Pentecost

Matthew 19:16-26

Now behold, one came and said to Him, "Good Teacher, what good thing shall I do that I may have eternal life?"

So He said to him, "Why do you call Me good? No one is good but One, that is, God. But if you want to enter into life, keep the commandments." He said to Him, "Which ones?" Jesus said, "'You shall not murder,' 'You shall not commit adultery,' 'You shall not steal,' 'You shall not bear false witness' and you shall love your neighbour as yourself.' "The young man said to Him, "All these things I have kept from my youth. What do I still lack?"

Jesus said to him, "If you want to be perfect, go, sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me." But when the young man heard that saying, he went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions.

Then Jesus said to His disciples, "Assuredly, I say to you that it is hard for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven. And again I say to you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God." When His disciples heard it, they were greatly astonished, saying, "Who then can be saved?"


But Jesus looked at them and said to them, "With men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

The formal observance of the law (Ten Commandments) does not equal fulfillment of all the commandments of God. "Keeping the letter of the law" can create a false satisfaction about virtue. Ones salvation does not depend upon external things, but on virtues of the soul, that is, faith, hope, and love. These result in salvation and many of us lack these virtues. Our Saviour calls us to voluntarily follow Him for the cause of the Kingdom. The image of the camel going through the eye of the needle, shows us the difficulty of salvation for those who are attached to riches.


